Crafted from materials like porcelain, bronze, and glass, these burners often featured elaborate designs, including classical motifs, floral patterns, and romantic scenes. They were popular in salons and boudoirs, used to disperse pleasant fragrances and elevate the ambience of a space. Notable manufacturers like Sèvres and Baccarat produced these pieces, which reflected

the period's artistic movements, such as Romanticism and Neo-classicism
